#### **Duke University**

- Fuqua School of Business Master of Quantitative Management (MQM): Designed for college graduates with strong quantitative backgrounds, the MQM program provides training in analytics and communication within the contexts of finance, marketing, risk, or strategy. MQM <u>Capstone project</u>.

- Master of Geospatial Information Science and Technology (MGIST): The MGIST program equips students
  with the knowledge and tools to become high-end geospatial professionals using a curriculum that
  leverages computational sciences, geographic information systems, and natural resources. Students gain
  professional skills in areas such as project management, group dynamics, and communication. Capstone
  General Project Guidelines. Organizations interested in collaborating with the MGIST program should

- Master of Science in Analytics (MSA): The MSA program develops skills in mathematics, statistical
  programming, and working with data. MSA Practicum: A team-based learning experience that gives
  students the opportunity to conduct real-world analytics projects using data from sponsor organizations.

#### **UNC Chapel Hill**

- **Gillings School of Global Public Health:** Works to improve public health, promote individual well-being and eliminate health inequities in North Carolina and around the world.
  - Master's Capstone: A year-long service-learning course that gives students an opportunity to apply
    the knowledge and skills gained in the first year of the program by working in teams partnered with
