Descriptions are in alphabetical order and paraphrased from active links as of January 30, 2024. Links are organized by agency/organization.

NC Association of Workforce Development Boards (NCAWDB)

The NCAWDB is composed of 20 workforce boards and over 400 members that work to voice the needs of workers and employers in North Carolina. NCAWDB is a resource for employers and job seekers in NC.

NC Department of Adult Correction (NCDAC)

NCDAC began operations as a standalone Cabinet agency on January 1, 2023. NCDAC is responsible for the rehabilitation, care, custody and supervision of more than 30,000 individuals in prison and more than 75,000 people participating in <u>community supervision</u> programs.

- NCDAC and OSP <u>partnered</u> to develop the NCDAC <u>Priority Questions Research Agenda (PQRA) Action Plan</u>, which will set and define key areas in which the agency will research and develop evidence to inform its policy, programmatic, and operational decisions.
- Interested in conducting research with NCDAC? Start by reviewing the agency's research guidelines.
- <u>Field Ministry Program</u>: Trains incarcerated individuals to become offender counselors and to help as spiritual guides for offenders.

NC Department of Labor (NCDOL)

NCDOL's mission is to foster a safe, healthy, fair, and productive North Carolina through effective services, quality education, fair mandating, and public confidence.

- Occupational Safety and Health Division (OSH): Administers workplace safety and health laws that
 apply to the private sector and all state and local government agencies. OSH employees are
 responsible for inspecting the state's more than 20,000 elevators and 90,000+ boilers.
- Retaliatory Employment Discrimination Bureau: Responsible for enforcing the 1992 Retaliatory Employment Discrimination Act, which protects a range of areas and individuals, including wage and hour issues, workplace safety rights, and mine safety and health.

- <u>Mine and Quarry Bureau</u>: Enforces the 1975 Mine Safety and Health Act and provides education and training, technical assistance, and consultations.
- <u>Be Pro Be Proud Program</u>: This partnership between NCDOL and the N.C. Home Builders Educational and Charitable Foundation aims to stimulate student, parent, and educator interest in technical professions within the construction, manufacturing, transportation, and utility industries.

NC Department of Revenue (NCDOR)

NCDOR is a Cabinet-level executive agency charged with administering tax laws and collecting taxes on behalf of North Carolinians.

 NCDOR's Tax Research and Equity Division conducts equity and impact analyses of the agency's administration of tax law and its internal policies and procedures that affect the taxpayers of NC.

NC Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM)

OSBM provides objective information and analysis to ensure a balanced budget and effective stewardship of public resources.

The North Carolina State Demographer, housed in OSBM, compiles and analyzes <u>population and</u> <u>demographics data</u>, which may play a role in employers' ability to recruit and retain employees. The Read the State Demographer's <u>recent post</u> describing emerging population trends in NC.

NC Office of Strategic Partnerships (OSP)

OSP develops, launches, and enhances partnerships between state government and North Carolina's research and philanthropic sectors. This includes elevating state government's internal capacity to use and generate evidence in its policy and programmatic functions.
