North Carolina Network of Grantmakers Digital Equity Webinar (Code: ncng)

The North Carolina Network of Grantmakers (NCNG) and the North Carolina Office of Strategic Partnerships (OSP) Philanthropy Liaison collaborated to plan this virtual session for NCNG members and others. Speakers shared an overview of the state's efforts to ensure digital equity and inclusion for all North Carolina households and discussed opportunities for state government and philanthropy to work collaboratively to close the state's digital divide.

Key Terms

- **Digital equity*** means that everyone has technological capacity to participate fully in society, democracy, and economy.
- **Digital inclusion*** is the way to achieve digital equity. Inclusion encompasses access to affordable high-speed internet; devices that meet the needs of users; digital literacy training; quality tech support; and applications and online content that enable self-sufficiency, participation, and collaboration in a digital world.

- NCDIT's Office of Digital Equity and Literacy is leading state efforts to ensure digital equity and inclusion for all North Carolina households. NCDIT is deploying \$1.2B from federal American Rescue Plan Act (2021) funds, including \$971M to build infrastructure and awareness and \$50M for building capacity for ensuring digital literacy among all North Carolinians (see <u>NCDIT (January 2023). "It's</u> *Time to Close the Digital Divide," slide 7*) and anticipates additional federal funding opportunities.
- Philanthropy is uniquely positioned to facilitate public-private partnerships needed to realize digital equity and inclusion for all communities. Given their positions of trust in North Carolina communities, foundations may leverage their expertise, networks, flexibility to innovate, and ability to elevate community voices to convene stakeholders and facilitate collaboration. They may apply collective action informed by NCDIT's plan to ensure that North Carolina becomes the most digitally equitable state in the US by 2030.
- The Reidsville Area Foundation and the Dogwood Health Trust reflect two foundations different in terms of assets and staff capacities employing different strategies for supporting digital equity and inclusion. The Reidsville Area Foundation exercised its convening authority to spearhead the community getting organized and putting resources into broadband infrastructure. The Dogwood Health Trust, a regional funder, focused on building capacity to develop and implement plans for ensuring internet access and affordability in each of the 18 counties it supports.
