North Carolina Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM)

OSBM serves North Carolinians by providing objective information and analysis to ensure a balanced budget and effective stewardship of public resources. Developing and executing the state budget drives much of the work at OSBM.

- <u>Evaluation Fund Grants</u>: The North Carolina Evaluation Fund was established to support research partnerships that inform policy and program decisions. OSP can help applicants advertise their project on the <u>NC Project Portal</u> to identify a research partner. OSBM anticipates awarding 5-10 grants totaling up to \$1 million by October 31, 2022. The deadline for round two proposal submissions is August 31, 2022.

North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ)

DEQ is the lead agency for the protection of North Carolina's environmental resources. It administers regulatory programs designed to protect air quality, water quality, and the public's health.
