**Subject:** Armory and Facility Development Plan

**Date:** July 1, 2023

*Pursuant to N.C.G.S. 127A-210(a), the Department of Public Safety shall prepare a statewide plan for armories for a period of seven years into the future, no later than July 1 of each year.*

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The Armory and Facilities Development Plan was created from the North Carolina Army National Guard's (NCARNG) Installation Strategic Action Plan (ISAP) named NCARNG Readiness Center Transformation Plan (NCRCTP). The purpose of the Master Plan is to provide the NCARNG a Long-Range Capital Investment Strategy to replace its smaller aging primary training facilities (Armories) aligned with 1950's population demographics. The regional facility concept will allow for supporting facilities, consisting of aviation, training sites, and logistics activities to ensure the Guard is ready to serve the needs of North Carolina and the Country for the next 50 years.

**Definitions**

**Military Construction Army National Guard (MCNG)** – the program consists of three parts, each with a separate authorization and appropriation line from Congress: Major Military Construction (MILCON), Unspecified Minor Military Construction (UMMC), and Planning and Design (PD).

**DD Forms 1390/1391** – the basic programming document for all MILCON projects. These forms are used for justifying and requesting MILCON funded projects. Annually the Construction Facilities & Management Office (CFM&O) must update and resubmit the DD Forms until forms are authorized and appropriated.

**Construction and Facilities Management Officer (CFMO)**- The only individual within the NCARNG who has the authority to classify work, which is the final step before project approval and commencement. Additionally, the CFMO is the one individual within the NCARNG through whom all real property actions involving Federal funds or activity must go.



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**National Guard Bureau (NGB) Form 420-R** - Utilized for all construction projects greater than \$25,000.00 and up to the statutory threshold of \$2,000,000.00. The form is utilized for requesting Sustainment Restoration and Modernization (SRM) projects (less construction) between \$100,000.00 and \$3,000,000.00.

**The NCARNG Master Plan** – Utilizes a HUB and Spoke concept for Six (6) Regional Readiness Centers (RRC) HUBs with operational space for approximately 450 Soldiers, equipment, and administrative space with expansion capability for 1,200 Soldiers. The SPOKEs will maintain a connection to North Carolina's rural areas, honoring the grassroots heritage of the National Guard, serve as key staging areas during emergencies, and retain the ability to respond to future shifts in demographics. These facilities and their supporting facilities will serve as the backbone of the NCARNG Capital Investment Strategy.

### Description of Project Worksheets

**Projects Completed** – The following information provides details of projects completed or expected to be completed in the upcoming year:

These were completed during the Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2023. The Morganton Regional Readiness Center's Grand Opening will occur 2 August 2023. (Enclosure 1)

**Projects Approved and Funds have been appropriated** – The following information provides details of the Priority Projects listed in Enclosure 1.

Project Priority 1, The Hamlet Consolidated Repairs and Renovation project is estimated to be completed at the end of FFY23 or the beginning of FFY24.

Project Priority 2, Ft Fisher Bldg. 122 - The federal government provided funds for this SRM project. We are executing this project currently.

Project Priority 3, Camp Butner ACFT Fitness Area Site – The federal government provided funds for this project. We are executing this project currently.

Project Priority 4, Reidsville Building/Expansion (Rockingham County) – We anticipate this project to be under contract by the end of FFY 23. The federal government has provided funding for this project. We are looking for the State Matching funds for this project.

Project Priority 5, Salisbury Simulator Project – the federal government provided federal funds and the state has provided R and R funds for this project. We will contract this construction project prior to the end of FFY23.

Project Priority 6, Combined Surface Maintenance Shop (CSMS) Roof Replacement – the federal government provided funding for this roof replacement. This project will be completed with 100% reimbursed funds.

Project Priority 7, Winston-Salem Storage Building (Forsyth County) – due to a shortage of storage for equipment the federal government has provided federal funds to be matched with state funds to construct a new storage building.



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Project Priority 8, Winston-Salem POL Storage (Forsyth County) - The federal government provided funds for this project, but the required State matching funds have not been received. (Enclosure 1)

**Projects Approved and Funds have not been appropriated** – The following information provides details of the Priority Projects listed in Enclosure 2. This list of projects supports the Capital Improvement and Repair projects for the Spoke and Supporting facilities. The SRM projects have been approved but NCARNG has not received federal or State funding approval, although our federal Operations and Maintenance budget is authorized to be utilized for these types of projects on a 420R. NCARNG's strategy is to initiate larger projects by executing a limited number of designs (2 Designs) and construction projects (2 Construction projects) annually. The size of these projects is an attempt to bring the maximum amount of federal funds to the state while having the greatest impact on the facility. These projects will allow us to increase square footage where needed, improve energy efficiencies, and extend the life of our aging facilities.

Priority Project 1 & 2, NCARNG Museum and Constable Building – the NC National Guard is authorized to receive federal matching funds for Operations and Maintenance, but the Capital Improvement portion will be a requirement of the State.

Priority Project 3, USPF&O Warehouse Renovation JFHQ Complex (Wake County) (2024-25) – the federal government has funded their portion of a 50/50% matching design funds. The NCARNG will be requesting the federal portion for construction during the federal FY 2024. This project will need 50% state matching funds.

Priority Project 4, Rocky Mount SF Complex (2025-28) – Force Structure changes require the relocation of Special Forces personnel. This is the optimal location for this type of unit due to the amount of land and proximity to airports for training.

Priority Projects 5, Louisburg (2025-26) – the General Assembly funded the design portion for this project. We will execute the design upon receipt of the federal matching funds.

Priority Projects 6-8, Various Locations (2025-29) – these projects are planned to support the Long-Range Capital Investment Strategy and is included in our federal funds' requests.

Priority Projects 9-17, Various Locations (2028-beyond) – these projects are planned to support the Long-Range Capital Investment Strategy, but additional information will be needed as we get closer to executing the projects. There are additional projects required but they are proposed past the 7-year timeline of the report. (Enclosure 2)

**HUB Projects, MILCON, and Supporting Facilities** – This list of projects support the Regional Readiness Center concept. The list provides all major construction projects in construction or planned in Enclosure 3.

Project Priority 1-2 are funded utilizing 100% federal funds.

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Project Priority 3 is the ConnectNC bond funding along with CI Supplement for the McLeansville Regional Readiness Center.

Project Priority 4 is funded with ConnectNC bond funding along with CI Supplement for a renovation to the Wilkes County Readiness Center.

Project 5 is a supporting maintenance facility due to increased amounts of equipment at the HUB facility located in Guilford County. We expect federal funds available for construction of this facility in federal Fiscal Year 2023/24. These funds will be available for state matching funds based on facility requirements.

Project Priority 6-8 - (1) HUB facility and is projected to cost \$35M and will require State Matching funds and (2) Supporting Facility Designs for Aviation Aircraft Maintenance Hangars.

Project Priority 9 - The Hoke County project will require Asbestos removal and demolition prior to construction. No funds have been appropriated for this project by the state or federal government. This project is currently listed as State Funded but every effort will be made to provide federal funds when available. (Enclosure 3)

In conclusion, the NCARNG is taking steps to improve their facility footprint in order to provide a **Ready, Reliable, Responsive, and Relevant** force for the citizens of North Carolina when called upon. The Governor and General Assembly has recognized that providing state appropriations allows us to better compete for federal reimbursement for the state. NCARNG is focused on accomplishing the Governor's vision for upgrading state facilities as well as gaining efficiencies by partnering with other state agencies. NCARNG is leading the way in this endeavor and stand ready to execute.
