SUBJECT: New Grant Award

Pursuant to G.S. 143C-5-4(9) the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) submits the attached Notification of Grant Award (FY22 Byrne State Crisis Intervention Grant Program (SCIP)) for consultation with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

The NC Department of Public Safety Governor's Crime Commission has been awarded the FY 2022-2023 State Crisis Intervention Program grant. The SCIP award amount is \$7,619,902 with a maximum of \$761,990.20 (10% of award) available for direct administrative costs. The start date for the award will be 10/1/2022 and the award will have a duration of 48 months. The award does not require a match obligation.

Grant funds will be used to provide support to North Carolina state and local agencies in the following programmatic areas:

Behavioral Health Deflection

SCIP funds will be used to support both local and state agencies with Behavioral Health Community programs including juvenile violence intervention initiatives and funding to expand the work of the Behavioral Threat Assessment (BeTA) unit, housed in the State Bureau of Investigation.

Law Enforcement Safety and Security

SCIP funds will be used to establish a statewide Office of Violence Prevention. The Office of Violence Prevention will coordinate efforts across state government agencies and law enforcement, improve data collection and sharing, recommend and implement state level solutions, offer technical assistance to local officials, and promote collaboration.

Court Based Programs

SCIP funds will be utilized to assist local jurisdictions in reviewing and improving their local domestic violence systems as well as juvenile court systems. This will be a collaborative effort with the unified courts system and the Administrative Office of the Courts, along with experts and partners such as the UNC School of Government and the Conference of District Attorneys.

OSBM has approved this new funding, and now submits the notice of Grant Award for consultation.
