SUBJECT: New Grant Award – EOC Grant

Pursuant to G.S. 143C-5-4(9), as amended by S.L. 2021-180, the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) submits the attached Notification of Grant Award (2022 Emergency Operations Center Grant) for consultation with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

The Emergency Operations Grant is a new funding opportunity under FEMA. The new program aims to improve emergency management and preparedness capabilities by supporting flexible, sustainable, secure, strategically located, and fully interoperable Emergency Operations Centers to address identified deficiencies and needs. Fully capable emergency operations facilities at the state and local levels are essential to a comprehensive national emergency management system. In addition, they are necessary to ensure continuity of operations and continuity of government in major disasters or emergencies caused by any hazard.

Upon award of the grant, North Carolina Emergency Management plan to do the following:

- Implement the program by providing funding for newly constructed facilities in the City of Asheboro and Wake County;
- Improve the capabilities of our Emergency Operations Center by upgrading the technology and cyber security of the facility in Yancey County;
- Renovate a current building for our Emergency Operations Center in Cherokee County.

These upgrades will improve communications, minimize disruptions during an event or crisis, and increase response to incidents. OSBM has approved this new funding, and now submits the Amended Notice of Grant Award for consultation.

30 Purpose of grant or amendment

The fiscal year (FY) 2022 Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Grant Program is intended to improve emergency management and preparedness capabilities by supporting flexible, sustainable, secure, strategically located, and fully interoperable EOCs with a focus on addressing identified deficiencies and needs. Fully capable emergency operations facilities at the state and local levels are an essential element of a comprehensive national emergency management system and are necessary to ensure continuity of operations and continuity of government in major disasters or emergencies caused by any hazard.
The FY 2022 EOC Grant Program will provide \$4,281,250 (FEDERAL FUNDS) for equipping, upgrading or constructing the EOC projects for: Cherokee (\$131,250); City of Ashboro (\$3,000,000); Wake (\$1,000,000); and Yancey (\$150,000).
