Pursuant to G.S. 143C-5-4(9) the Office of State Budget and Management (OSBM) submits the attached Notification of Grant Award (Reintegration of Ex-Offenders First Step Act Initiative) for consultation with the Joint Legislative Commission on Governmental Operations.

The First Step Act Initiative is a new funding opportunity from the United States Department of Labor and the United States Department of Justice. This new opportunity will provide targeted employment services to federally incarcerated individuals as they approach community reentry. It will provide job training and skills development services to program participants for the specific labor market needs of their community.

This program will improve the employment outcomes of returning citizens and increase the capacity of justice and workforce partnership. OSBM has approved this funding, and now the Amended notice of Grant Award for consultation.
